INVESTMENT OBJECTIVE

The Sub-Fund aims to provide income and long-term capital growth from a portfolio primarily made up of equity securities issued by companies throughout the world. As the Sub-Fund may invest globally, it may be exposed to countries considered to be emerging markets.

INVESTMENT STRATEGY

The Sub-Fund's benchmark is the MSCI ACWI Index (the "Index"). The Index has been selected as the benchmark because it is representative of the investment universe of the Sub-Fund and it is therefore an appropriate performance comparator. The majority of the Sub-Fund's equity securities may not necessarily be components of or have weightings derived from the Index. The Investment Manager has a wide range of discretion relative to the Index. While the Sub-Fund will hold assets that are components of the Index, it may also invest in companies, countries or sectors that are not included in, and that have different weightings from, the Index in order to take advantage of investment opportunities. It is expected that over long time periods, the Sub-Fund's performance will differ to a significant extent from the Index. However, over short time periods, the Sub-Fund's performance may be close to the Index, depending on market conditions. For further details, please refer to the fund documents.

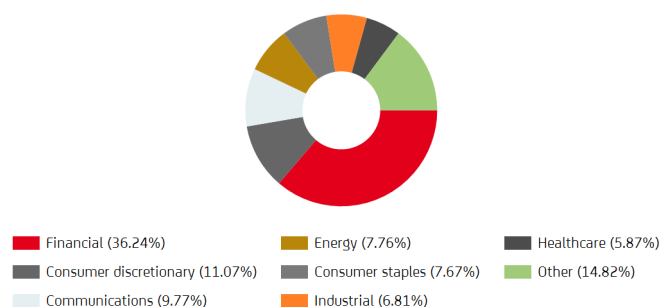

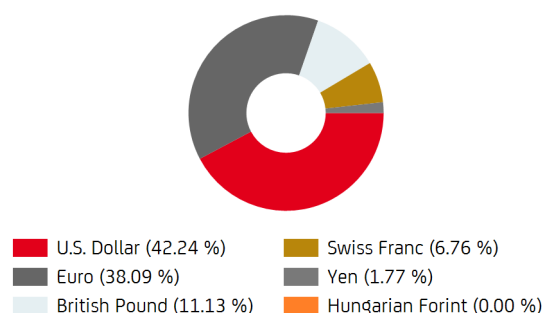
CURRENT COMPOSITION OF THE INVESTMENT PORTFOLIO

COMPOSITION OF THE INVESTMENT PORTFOLIO BY CURRENCY AS AT 31. March 2025

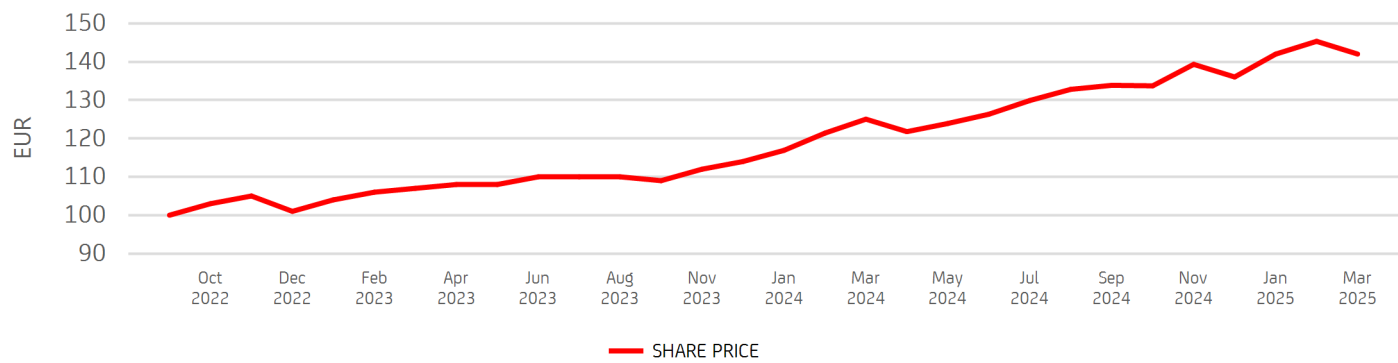

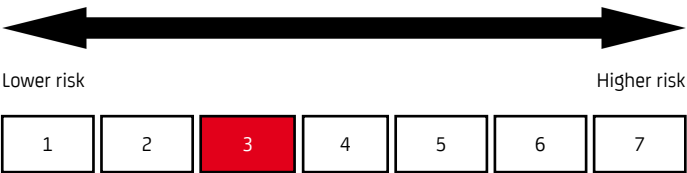

RISK PROFILE



The historical data used to calculate the summary risk indicator may not be a reliable indicator of the future risk profile of the sub-fund. There is no guarantee that the risk category illustrated above will remain unchanged. A classification of the sub-fund in the lower category does not automatically mean that the investment is risk-free.

Risk classification of the sub-fund

The sub-fund’s strategy is to invest in different assets and derivative instruments. Due to the relatively high volatility of these investments, the fund is classified in risk category 3.

Other relevant risks

The credit rating of the issuers of the securities held by the sub-fund and its strategy may deteriorate over time. In the unlikely event that the issuer of a security is forced to declare itself insolvent, the value of the securities could fall significantly. This could lead to a reduction in the market price of the sub-fund that exceeds the general market fluctuations.

The sub-fund’s performance and the ability to buy, sell or redeem fund units may be hampered by economic developments and uncertainty caused by political events, changes in government policy, restrictions on capital flows and changes to the regulatory framework. Events such as natural disasters and political unrest can also have negative repercussions.

Under unfavourable market conditions, it may be difficult for the sub-fund to sell the securities held without incurring significant losses, or it may even be impossible to sell certain securities.

In this extreme case, it is possible that the sub-fund will experience payment difficulties, which could prevent investors from redeeming all their units immediately and without incurring significant losses. The sub-fund may perform derivative transactions and is therefore exposed to the risk of a counterparty failing to honour its contractual obligations. We reduce counterparty risk on derivative transactions by requiring our contractual counterparty to provide minimum collateral, as stipulated by the relevant regulatory requirements.

The sub-fund may incur losses due to malfunctions or inadequate internal procedures and systems, operational risks or external events. This includes the possibility of incurring losses due to a breach of applicable regulatory requirements, including losses caused by changes to the regulatory framework on existing transactions.

Derivatives are subject to specific risks arising from the “leverage effect”, which amplifies the change in the market price of a derivative compared with the actual change in the market price of its underlying. The risk of loss increases as the amount of leverage of the derivative increases.

Risks not sufficiently taken into account in the indicator include the following: equity risk, bond risk, commodity risk, risk arising from multi-asset investments, sustainability risk, risks related to investment funds, risk of debt securities, convertible bonds, contingent convertible (CoCo) bonds, hybrid bonds and bonds with a rating below investment grade or no rating, early repayment and extension risk, derivatives and counterparty risk, short position risk, high leverage risk, currency risk, geopolitical risk and emerging markets risk.
